

GARBAGE COLLECTION NOTICE FOR LOCAL SERVICE DISTRICTS RESIDENTS OF KINGS COUNTIES AFFECTED BY THE RECENT FLOODING

Special Collections have been established for those who have been affected by the recent flooding in the following areas:

Local Service Districts of Hampton (Nauwigewauk), Kingston, Westfield(East) (West), and Greenwich.

Residents are advised that flood-related waste will be collected as soon as possible but that this may take some time. Crews will follow a collection route and will only stop at each house once during the cleanup so residents are asked to have their items sorted and ready by **June 4**.

Accepted Waste for pick up includes appliances (remove doors and covers for safety), furniture, carpeting, insulation, paper products, construction debris, etc. Small loose items should be bagged or boxed.

Waste should be separated as follows:

- Small loose items – bagged or boxed
- Larger construction debris (lumber/concrete blocks/shingles)
- Mattresses
- Appliances

In addition, dumpsters for spoiled food have been placed in the following areas:

- Long Reach Fire Hall – 3564 Route 845, Long Reach
- Peninsula Fire Hall – 1383 Route 845, Clifton Royal
- James H William Hall – 2560 Route 845, Carters Point

For information regarding **Hazardous materials** such as petroleum storage and propane tanks, chemical containers, dead animal carcasses, please contact your regional office of the Department of Environment for further direction: **(506) 658-2558**.

Regular household waste will be collected as usual, and should be placed separately from flood-related items.

People wishing to independently dispose of non-hazardous items may take them to the following locations at no charge: [Crane Mountain landfill](#) (506)738-1212, [Fredericton Region Solid Waste](#) (506)453-9938 and the [Regional Service Commission 8 transfer station](#) (506)433-3836. Regular household hazardous waste generated by the flood can also be taken at these facilities. People should check each facility's hours of operation, the schedule for Household Hazardous Waste Days, and inform staff at the gate that they are disposing of flood-damaged items.
